



SENIOR SURVEY RESULTS

2022-2023

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Introduction

This report summarizes the results of the University of Northwestern (UNW) Senior Survey administered to graduation seniors in December 2022 and May 2023 as part of the pre-commencement procedures. The survey was completed by 303 (79.5%) students of the graduating classes using an online format.

Data is also provided to show comparison with previous senior classes where available.

Items for the survey were selected by the Assessment Steering Committee with input from a variety of campus offices and committees.

Satisfaction with Academic Life
