# Internships in Washington, DC and St. Paul

During the Fall 2023 semester several of our students completed political science internships in Washington, DC: Nick Frese, Caleb Phillips, Isaac Pilon, and Will Jaenchen served in the offices of US Senators and a Christian advocacy organization. In Minnesota, Alejandro Najera-Wolcott completed his internship with a local law firm. In the spring semester three students completed internships in the Minnesota Legislature: Selah Her and Hayden Kuiper worked in the House of Representatives, while Christian Watkins served in the Senate. These students all had an opportunity to apply their learning in practical ways in a workplace setting.





We regularly invite guests to our classrooms, to provide students a time to engage with a variety of specialists. This year **Prof. Leanna Swanson** invited Assistant Ramsey County Attorney **Makenzie Lee** to speak to her US National Government course on the workings of our criminal justice system.
